[How TO GET TO THE SHANGHAI FISHERIES UNIVERSITY?]

We will use facilities in the main campus of the Shanghai Fisheries University (SFU) located at 334 Jun Gong Road, Shanghai 20090, China. The SFU is well connected to the Pudong International Airport (60-90 minutes depending on the traffic situation) to the Hongqiao International airport (60-90 minutes), to the central railway station (40-60 minutes) and also major hotels in the town (30-60 minutes). The Bund (heart of the city) can be reached by Bus 22. At the air port please get the taxi with the fare meter and show the card next page if you stay in the Guest House on campus. Then the taxi will take you to the University.

The taxi fare is about Chinese 160 Yuan (max) from Pu Dong International Airport to the Shanghai Fisheries University and100 Chinese Yuan (max) from Hongqiao International Airport to the Shanghai Fisheries University.

If you don't stay in the guest house on campus, please check locations of your hotels and learn the rough time (minutes) to reach to the SFU. Those who will present papers need to add extra 30 minutes to make a good presentation with a normal breath!?

[VERY IMPORTANT NOTES: POTENTIAL LANGAUGE PROLEMS]

Almost all taxi drivers <u>cannot understand English</u> at all. When you use the taxi, you need show names of the University and Hotels and also their addresses in **Chinese letters**. For Chinese letters of the Hotels, you can obtain from the home pages: make a copy and keep it in your wallet. Here is the name of the University and its address in Chinese and also the contact point for help, so cut it and keep it in your wallet:

There are always **terrible traffic jams** in all the Shanghai city area. You need to add at least an extra 30 minutes in order to reach your destination such as the SFU on time. <u>This is important especially for the presenters.</u>


